

# A Partial List of Protesters Killed by the Islamic Republic

This list is only a **tiny fragment** of a far greater crime.

The names that follow are merely **examples**, a small and incomplete selection from among the **thousands of lives taken** by the Islamic Republic during the January protests. They do not represent the full scale of the killings. What they reveal is only a narrow opening onto a vast field of loss. Most of those killed were **workers**: laborers, drivers, teachers, nurses, technicians, shop employees, informal workers, people whose survival depended on their daily labor, and who took to the streets in protest against poverty, exploitation, and a life made unlivable.

Behind every name stands a life cut short, a family torn apart, and a truth the regime has worked relentlessly to erase. This documentation exists in spite of censorship, intimidation, enforced silence, and the systematic destruction of evidence. Countless victims remain unnamed; many bodies were never returned; many deaths were concealed, denied, or quietly buried without explanation or accountability.

This list insists on memory against erasure. It exists to state clearly that these deaths were not accidents, not excesses, and not isolated incidents—but part of a **deliberate and systematic campaign of lethal repression** against an unarmed population, with the working class bearing the highest cost.





**Mahdi Mirzaei**, a 23-year-old from Arak, was shot dead by security forces using live ammunition during the Tehran protests on **Thursday, January 8**.  
Mahdi worked as a hairdresser in Tehran.



**Kamran Akbari**, a 45-year-old from Islamabad, was killed after being shot directly with live ammunition by government forces during protest gatherings on the evening of **January 8, 2026**, in the Elahiyyeh neighborhood of Kermanshah.  
Kamran was a schoolteacher in the public education system.



**Amir Ali Jalilian**, a 65-year-old from **Islamabad-e Gharb**, was killed after being directly shot by security forces during the evening protests on **January 8, 2026**.  
Amir Ali was a truck driver.



**Sajad Kiani** was shot dead by security forces on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of **Islamabad-e Gharb**.  
Sajad was a dentist.



**Akbar Jahangiri**, a 36-year-old from Isfahan, was killed by direct gunfire from security forces during protests on **January 10, 2026**.  
He was the father of a three-year-old daughter and was awaiting the birth of his second child, who was born just three days after his death. Akbar worked as a laborer in an auto body repair and painting workshop.



**Hajar Eshaghi**, a 42-year-old from Isfahan and the mother of a teenage son, was killed by gunfire from government forces on **January 9, 2026**. She worked in the commercial department of a company in Isfahan and was part of the country's active workforce.

**Hanieh Soltani**, a 23-year-old from Ahvaz, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the Zeitoun-e Karmandi area after being shot directly by Islamic Republic security forces. She was struck in the head, neck, and face. Hanieh worked at a hair salon.

**Arshia Ahmadpour**, an 18-year-old originally from Izeh and residing in Baharestan, Isfahan, was killed after being directly shot by security forces on **January 9, 2026**, in Baharestan. Arshia worked as a hairdresser in Isfahan.

**Mojtaba Shahpari**, a 32-year-old originally from Izeh and residing in the city of Baharestan, was killed by security forces on **January 8, 2026**. Mojtaba worked as a security guard.

**Mohammad Zamani**, originally from Eyvan in Ilam Province, was killed after being directly shot by military security forces during the protests on **January 8, 2026**, in Tehran. Mohammad had been living in Tehran for several years and worked as a laborer.

**Hossein Poushneh**, a 19-year-old from Baghmalek in Khuzestan Province, was killed by gunfire from government agents on **January 9, 2026**. Hossein worked at a haleem shop and had traveled from Baghmalek to Ahvaz for employment.



**Zahra Moradi**, a 27-year-old originally from Bukan and residing in Tehran, was killed after being shot by security forces during the protests on **January 8, 2026**, in the Tehranpars neighborhood. Zahra worked at a hair salon.



**Abolfazl Dehghani**, a young man from Bijar, was killed after being directly shot by government security forces during the protests on **January 8, 2026**. Abolfazl worked as a municipal sanitation worker for the city of Bijar.



**Mohammadreza Ahmadparast**, a 27-year-old from Taybad, was killed by security forces during popular protests on **the evening of January 9, 2026**, on Kish Island. Mohammadreza worked at a cosmetics store.



**Asal Shakeri**, a 28-year-old, was shot dead by security forces during popular protests in the city of Tabriz on **January 8, 2026**. Asal was a photographer and videographer.



**Reza Attaei**, a 22-year-old from Torbat-e Jam, was killed after being shot in the head by security forces during protests on **January 9, 2026**, on Tabarsi Street in Mashhad.

Reza was a laborer.




**Mosab Saeedi**, a 23-year-old from Torbat-e Jam, was killed after being shot by security forces during the protests in Mashhad on **January 9, 2026**. Mosab worked as a construction laborer.



**Mehrdad Danehpash**, a 59-year-old from Tehran, was killed by gunfire from security forces on **January 8, 2026**, at Sadeghieh Square. Mehrdad held a PhD in civil engineering and was an employee of the National Oil Company—part of the country's skilled workforce who lost his life while protesting the nation's dire conditions.



**Sadegh Ghodsi**, originally from Takab and residing in Qal'eh Hasan Khan, was shot dead by security forces during popular protests in the city in **January 2026**. Sadegh worked as a fruit vendor.



**Ardesir Zarei**, a 40-year-old laborer, father of three children, originally from Dalahu and residing in Saveh, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, after being shot directly from behind by Islamic Republic security forces while on his way to a pharmacy. His body was buried seven days later in his hometown.

**Erfan Momeni**, a 23-year-old foundry worker from Deh-e Now, Isfahan, was shot during popular protests and sustained a gunshot wound to his left thigh. According to those close to him, his physical condition was improving, and there was even talk of a “full recovery.”

However, at midday one day before his death, the family was suddenly informed of a sharp deterioration in his condition, and Erfan was transferred to the intensive care unit (ICU). The following morning, his death was announced—under suspicious circumstances and without any clear or transparent explanation.



Reports further indicate that the family was forced to pay **1.3 billion tomans** to retrieve Erfan Momeni’s body—a staggering sum demanded to reclaim the remains of a son who had not been delivered alive to the hospital.

**Reza Sheikh Barani**, a 32-year-old from Ramhormoz in Khuzestan Province, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in Fardis, Karaj, after being shot directly with live ammunition by Islamic Republic security forces. According to reports, the bullet struck his head, and the severity of the injury was such that his skull was completely shattered.



Reza had migrated from Khuzestan to Karaj to make a living. He was a hairdresser and also worked as a laborer in a perfume shop to cover basic living expenses and support his mother. Having lost his father, he was forced to work from a young age—a hardworking young man who carried the burden of life on his shoulders alone.

**Danial Sabzikar**, a mechanic and industrial worker from Ramhormoz in Khuzestan Province, was wounded by a direct gunshot to the abdomen by security forces on **January 8, 2026**, and was taken to hospital. According to his family—particularly his brother—Danial was subsequently killed in the hospital with what they described as a *coup de grâce*.



Due to unemployment and the lack of job opportunities in his hometown, Danial had traveled to Qazvin Province in search of work.



**Mostafa Khorsandian**, a 25-year-old, was shot dead by government security forces during popular protests on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of Rudbar, Gilan Province.

Mostafa was an auto mechanic.



**Hossein Mohebpour**, a 26-year-old from the village of Dastgard-e Sourg in the Goharan District of Bashagard County, was killed on the evening of **January 9, 2026**, after being shot directly in the chest by security forces during the crackdown on popular protests on Kish Island.

Hossein worked as a dock laborer at Marjan Port.



**Ehsan Rasouli**, from the village of Fariabad in Bakharz County, Khorasan Province, was killed by government security forces on the evening of **January 9, 2026**, during popular protests in Mashhad.

Ehsan worked as a shop assistant.



**Hamed Saleh Rahman**, a 33-year-old from the village of Musaabad in Torbat-e Jam, was killed after being shot in the head by government forces during the protests in Qeshm on **January 8, 2026**.

Hamed was a seasonal laborer who had traveled to Qeshm in search of work.



**Mehran Rafiei**, from Zemidan in Lahijan, was shot dead by security forces on the evening of **January 8, 2026**.

Mehran was a hairdresser.



**Mohammad Seydi**, a 23-year-old from Sarpol-e Zahab, was killed by security forces during popular protests in Karaj.

Mohammad was a laborer and had been living in Karaj in search of work.



**Bijan Mostafavi**, a 55-year-old retired education worker originally from Sonqor and residing in Karaj, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in Karaj after government security forces opened fire on his private vehicle. He was shot while inside the car together with his wife and child.



**Sajad Gorji**, from Dinevar County in Kermanshah Province, was killed in Tehran on **January 8, 2026**, after being fatally shot by security forces.

Sajad was a seasonal laborer who had traveled to Tehran in search of work.



**Masoud Sadeghi**, originally from Sarpol-e Zahab in Kermanshah Province and **born in 1988**, was identified in Tehran after a full week during which his family and relatives had no information about his fate. He was killed during popular protests on **January 9, 2026**, after being directly shot by government forces.

Masoud was an employee of the Qasr-e Shirin Customs Office.



**Shokoufeh Abdi**, from Shazand County in Markazi Province, was killed after being directly shot by government security forces during the evening protests in the city of Arak on **January 8, 2026**.

Shokoufeh worked at a photography studio.



**Mohammad Alizadeh**, a 34-year-old from Fouman County, was killed by direct gunfire from government security forces on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of Rasht. Mohammad worked as a laborer at a traditional restaurant in Rasht.



**Mohammad Hossein Mousavi**, a 24-year-old from Shahr-e Reza, was killed after being shot with live ammunition by security forces on **January 8, 2026**. Mohammad Hossein worked at a café in Shahr-e Reza.



**Delaram Saman**, a 37-year-old from Shiraz, was killed after being shot by security forces during protests in **Pardis, Tehran**, on **January 9, 2026**. Delaram was an employee at the Tehran Technology Park.



**Mehdi Ebadollahi**, a 36-year-old originally from Qorveh and residing in Tehran, was killed by direct gunfire from security forces during popular protests in the city on **Friday, January 9, 2026**.

Mehdi Ebadollahi had previously worked as a professional heavy-vehicle driver and, over the past five years, had been employed at an insurance company in Tehran.



**Parvin Azizi**, a 51-year-old from Qasr-e Shirin, was killed after being shot by government security forces on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of Andisheh, Alborz Province. Parvin was a hospital nurse.



**Naeem Abdollahi**, originally from Kermanshah and residing in Tehran, was shot dead by security forces during the events of **January 2026** in the Naziabad neighborhood of Tehran. Naeem was a professor of political science and law at the University of Tehran.



**Samaneh Asgari Bazargan**, a 42-year-old, was killed by security forces during popular protests in the city of Lahijan on **January 8, 2026**. Samaneh was a tailor.



**Khodayar (Ali) Bagheri Kehish**, originally from Masjed Soleyman and residing in Tehran, was shot dead by security forces during popular protests at **Haft-Howz Square in Narmak**. Khodayar was an agricultural engineer and a university lecturer.



**Amirhossein Amiri Vafa**, a 29-year-old, was killed after being directly shot by security forces during popular protests in the city of Mashhad on **January 9, 2026**. Amirhossein was a welder.



**Mojtaba Amiri**, a 31-year-old man, was killed after being shot by government forces on **January 9, 2026**, in the city of Mashhad. He lived in Torbat-e Jam but was present in Mashhad on that day. Mojtaba was a laborer.



**Abolfazl Norouzi**, a 14-year-old, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of Mashhad after being struck by live ammunition fired by security forces. Abolfazl was a child laborer and had been working at a heavy-machinery repair workshop for the past year.



**Ali Mohseni**, a 32-year-old from Malayer, was killed after being struck in the head by live ammunition on **January 8, 2026**.

Ali worked as a street vendor at Zandieh Square in Malayer.



**Mohsen Ghahremanpour**, a 22-year-old from Malayer, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the Tehranpars neighborhood in eastern Tehran after being shot by government security forces.

Mohsen worked as a laborer at a portable cabin manufacturing workshop in Tehran.



**Ali Zandieh-Pari**, a 26-year-old battery factory worker from Malayer, was present in the city on **January 8, 2026**, protesting the country's dire conditions.

According to reports, he was directly shot with live ammunition on Qaem-Maqami Street; the bullet struck his forehead, killing him instantly.




**Mahan Rostami**, a 21-year-old from the Goran area of Dalahu in Kermanshah Province, was among those killed during the popular protests in Kermanshah, in the Dowlatabad district. On **Thursday evening, January 8, 2026**, he was shot directly in the heart by Islamic Republic security forces and killed.

After leaving school, Mahan had been working in agriculture in his home village.



**Mohsen Ramezani**, a construction worker and ceramic installer, was killed by gunfire from Islamic Republic security forces during popular protests in Lenjan County, Isfahan Province.

His death is yet another example of the direct targeting of protesting workers—laborers who took to the streets in opposition to poverty, rising prices, and inhumane living conditions.



**Yavar Dehghani**, a 42-year-old from the Varnamehkhast area of Isfahan, was killed after being shot in the head by security forces during the night protests in **Zarrin Shahr** on **January 8, 2026**.



**Behnam Izadi** was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of **Nurabad-e Mamasani**, Fars Province, after being shot directly in the head by security forces. Behnam was a farmer.



**Reza Karimi-Far**, a 56-year-old retired schoolteacher, was killed during popular protests in the city of Chalus, in Mazandaran Province, after being struck by **five rounds of live ammunition** fired by government security forces. The bullets hit his leg and his heart, causing fatal injuries.



**Ramtin Bozorgmaqam**, a 30-year-old pharmacist from Chalus, was shot dead by government security forces on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**. Ramtin held a doctorate in pharmacy and worked at a local pharmacy.



**Ayoob Sharifi**, a 25-year-old resident of the Eram District in Dashtestan County, Bushehr Province, was killed on **Friday, January 9, 2026**, in the city of Kazerun, Fars Province, after being shot by Islamic Republic security forces.


According to an informed source, Ayoob's family—who live in a black tent settlement and face severe economic hardship—were forced to pay **700 million tomans** to IRGC agents as so-called “bullet compensation” in order to retrieve their son's body. The family raised the money by selling part of their flock of sheep and borrowing from others.



**Ramin Molla Esmaili**, a 40-year-old, was killed after being struck by bullets fired by security forces during popular protests in the city of Karaj. Ramin was an auto mechanic.




**Mohsen Arbabi**, a 20-year-old young man from the city of Gasht (Saravan), was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, in Karaj after being shot in the head with live ammunition by government security forces. Mohsen had traveled to Karaj in search of work as a laborer.



**Yaser Modir-Rosta** was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in the city of Karaj after being struck by gunfire from government security forces.

Yaser taught setar at a music institute in Karaj and, as a music educator, was part of the country's cultural workforce.



**Pedram Argha**, from Kermanshah, was shot dead by security forces during nationwide popular protests. Pedram was a dentist.



**Sajad Feyzi**, a 36-year-old from Kermanshah, was killed after being directly shot by security forces during popular protests on Nobahar Street in the city. Sajad worked as a lawyer.



**Farzad Kheirdar**, a 37-year-old from Kermanshah, was killed by government forces during popular protests in the city on **January 8, 2026**. Farzad was a mechanical engineer.



**Masoud Sadeghi**, a 37-year-old originally from Kermanshah and residing in Tehran, was killed by government security forces during popular protests. The exact date of his death remains unknown; after being missing for several days, his body was eventually identified in **Kahrizak**.

Masoud was an employee of Tehran Customs.



**Mostafa Alikhani Chamgardani**, a 37-year-old, was killed on **Friday, January 9, 2026**, in the town of **Chamgardan**, Isfahan Province, after being shot by security forces.

Mostafa was a worker at the Isfahan Steel Plant.



**Reza Mohammadi**, a 25-year-old from Gerash in Fars Province, was killed after being shot by government security forces during protests on **January 8, 2026**, in Bandar Abbas.

Reza worked as a driver in Bandar Abbas.



**Farshid Mokhtari**, from Yazdanshahr in Isfahan Province, was killed after being directly shot by Islamic Republic security forces during a nighttime gathering on **January 2, 2026**.

Farshid was a poet and a teacher—part of the education workforce—who had taken to the streets in protest against the catastrophic economic and living conditions, and lost his life as a result.



**Mohammad-Amin Aghilizadeh**, a 17-year-old resident of Fooladshahr, Isfahan, was killed by direct gunfire from government forces during popular protests on **Friday, January 9, 2026**.

Although he was a school student, Mohammad-Amin worked at a car wash to help cover his living and education expenses.




**Amirmohammad Mehdi Nemati-Nezhad**, a 17-year-old teenager, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, after being shot by Islamic Republic forces at **Shora Square in Arak**.

Amirmehdi was a child laborer and worked in a tailoring workshop.



**Armin Sultan Mohammadi**, a 19-year-old young man, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, after being shot with live ammunition by Islamic Republic security forces during protests in **Tehranpars**, Tehran. Armin worked as a building painter.



**Ali Ghorbani**, a 19-year-old, was killed after being shot in the heart with live ammunition by security forces during protests in the city of Pasargad on **January 8, 2026**. Ali was a laborer.

**Farshid Moradi**, a 28-year-old resident of Fooladshahr, was a welder employed on oil and petrochemical projects in Asaluyeh. On **January 8, 2026**, amid popular protests in Fooladshahr, he was targeted by Islamic Republic snipers. A bullet fired from a rooftop struck him in the head, killing him instantly at the scene.



After his death, Farshid's body was withheld from his family for several days. Authorities reportedly demanded **800 million tomans** for the release of his remains. When the family was unable to pay, they were coerced into declaring that Farshid had been a Basij member in order to secure the return of his body.



**Majid Astir**, a 25-year-old resident of the Ab-Motor neighborhood in Tehran, was killed on the evening of **January 9, 2026**, after being directly shot by government forces on Pirouzi Street.

Majid worked as a shop assistant in the Bagh-e Sepahsalar area of Tehran. According to reports, he was shot in the neck while trying to help another young man who had been injured, and died several hours later from the severity of his wounds.

Majid's father is a taxi driver in Tehran. He had two brothers, one of whom died of a heart attack two years ago; of the three brothers, only one now remains alive.



**Hamidreza Salimian**, a 27-year-old resident of Isfahan and the father of a three-month-old infant, was killed after being directly shot by Islamic Republic security forces on **January 9, 2026**.

Hamidreza was a worker in the steel-structure unit of Mobarakeh Steel Company and had taken to the streets in protest against the catastrophic economic and living conditions.



**Ali Ghazlaghi**, a 24-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, in Gorgan after being shot directly in the heart by security forces.

Ali was a construction electrician and had taken part in the protests against poverty, unemployment, and government corruption.




**Karim Heydari**, a 29-year-old resident of the Sadat neighborhood in Bandar Ganaveh, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, after being directly shot by government forces while taking part in protests as he was returning from work, still wearing his work clothes.

Karim was a laborer employed by an interior design company.



**Alireza Marvati**, a 21-year-old resident of Tehran, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, during popular protests after being directly shot in the head and neck.

Alireza worked as a mobile fruit vendor, selling produce from a pickup truck, and was part of the country's informal workforce.



**Farshid Soltani**, a 28-year-old resident of Tehran, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the Qal'eh Hasan Khan area after being directly shot by security forces.

Farshid worked at a barbershop and had taken to the streets in protest against poverty and social injustice.



**Omid Azimi**, a 26-year-old, was killed after being directly shot by security forces during the protests in Tehran on **Saturday, January 10, 2026**.

Omid lived with his ill mother and worked as a hairdresser, supporting his family through his labor.




**Farzin Rostami** (also known as **Farzin Poosteshkan**), a 28-year-old, was killed after being shot by security forces during popular protests at **Seh-Rah-e Simin** in Isfahan.

Farzin, who resided in Fereydunshahr, worked at a barbershop in Isfahan. He was shot in front of his workplace.



**Amirhossein Sohrabi**, a 21-year-old, was killed on **Monday, January 12, 2026**, in Tehran after being shot by security forces. His body was later found in **Kahrizak** and handed over to his family.

Amirhossein worked as a laborer at a garment manufacturing workshop in Tehran's Grand Bazaar.



**Samaneh Abdi**, a 24-year-old resident of Karaj, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, after being shot directly in the heart.

Samaneh held an associate degree in accounting and worked as a laborer at one of Karaj's large manufacturing plants in the Baghestan neighborhood.



**Soroush Khabbazian Moghaddam**, a 23-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in the Rabat-e Sevom area of Malekshahr, Isfahan, after being shot directly from behind by Islamic Republic security forces. Soroush was an English language instructor and translator.



**Erfan Sahebi**, a 25-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, on Jami Street in the city of Torbat-e Jam after being shot from behind and subsequently beaten by security forces.

Although Erfan held a bachelor's degree, he had turned to street vending due to the dire economic conditions and the lack of stable employment opportunities.



**Amirhossein Khodadadi**, a 22-year-old, was among those killed during the protests on **January 8, 2026**, in Najafabad, Isfahan.  
Amirhossein worked at a café.



**Reyhaneh Yousefi**, a 28-year-old, was killed on **Friday night, January 9, 2026**, in Tehran's Nazerabad neighborhood after being directly shot by Islamic Republic forces.  
Reyhaneh was a theater actor.



**Ali Karimi**, a 27-year-old young man, was killed during protests in the city of Falavarjan, Isfahan, after being struck by gunfire from government security forces.  
Ali worked at a pharmaceutical company.



**Amir Naderi**, a 27-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, after being directly shot with live ammunition by Islamic Republic security forces during popular protests in **Islamabad-e Gharb**.  
Amir was a seasonal laborer.



**Ali Ghasemi**, a 28-year-old, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, after being shot by security forces during popular protests in **Varamin**.  
Ali was a hairdresser.



**Mohammad Hadi Mehrtashfar**, a 28-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, at **Azadegan Square in Karaj**, after being directly shot by security forces.

Mohammad Hadi was a computer engineer and an English-language translator.



**Omid Zare**, a 22-year-old, was killed after being shot by government security forces during popular protests in **Rostamabad, Gilan Province**, on **January 8, 2026**. Omid was a hairdresser.



**Amirhossein Khandoozi**, a 26-year-old, was killed during popular protests in **Gorgan** on **January 8, 2026**, after being shot by government security forces. Amirhossein was an employee of a private company.



**Ali Behrouzi**, a 25-year-old, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, during popular protests in Tehran after being directly shot by government security forces in the **Haft-Hoz Square (Narmak)** area. Ali was an employee of one of the country's online sales platforms.



**Mohan Ghadami** (also known as **Mahan**), a 23-year-old, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the Vavan township of Islamshahr after being shot by security forces. Mohan worked as a hairdresser.



**Amir Movahedi**, a 25-year-old, was killed after being shot by government security forces during popular protests in **Rasht** on **January 9, 2026**. Amir was a hairdresser.



**Amirmohammad Najafi**, a 25-year-old, was killed by government security forces during popular protests in Karaj on the evening of **January 9, 2026**. Amirmohammad was a worker at **Iran Khodro Karaj**.



**Parsa Abbaspour**, a 24-year-old resident of Karaj, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the Fardis area after being struck by live ammunition fired by government security forces. Parsa worked as a sales assistant at a clothing store.



**Ali Mohammaddoust**, a 22-year-old resident of Chalus, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, during popular protests in Chalus after being shot by security forces. Ali worked as a sales assistant at a clothing store.



**Amin Rezaei**, a 31-year-old father of two young children, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, during protests at **Azadi Square in Kerman**, after being shot with live ammunition by Islamic Republic forces.

Amin worked as a technician repairing industrial equipment for cafés and was the primary breadwinner for his family.



**Mohammadhossein Khalaj**, a 35-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, during protests in the city of **Alvand**, Qazvin Province, after being directly shot by Islamic Republic forces.

He worked as a laborer at a juice and ice cream shop.



**Sajad Rahimi**, a 36-year-old, was killed on **Friday, January 9, 2026**, in Marvdasht, Fars Province, after being struck by live ammunition fired by security forces during popular protests. The bullet entered through his side and exited from the other, causing fatal injuries.

Sajad was a teacher at a technical high school in the city of Qeshm and an information technology specialist.



**Ahmad Alijani**, a 30-year-old, was killed on the night of **January 9, 2026**, in Kashmar County, Khorasan Province, after being shot with live ammunition by security forces.

Ahmad was the father of a three-year-old child and worked as a farmer in the village of Argha.



**Ayoob Resaneh**, a 36-year-old, was killed on the night of **January 9, 2026**, during protests in the village of **Hasanabad, Rask**, after being directly shot by Basij forces. Ayoob was a day laborer.



**Asal Mansouri**, a 30-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, during protests on **Heravi Street in Tehran**, after being shot from behind by security forces. Asal was a child psychologist.



**Mostafa Jamali Amiri**, a 37-year-old resident of Fooladshahr, Isfahan, was killed on the night of **January 8, 2026**, after being shot in the heart with live ammunition fired by government forces from the rooftop of the courthouse.

Mostafa worked as a laborer at a grocery store.



**Davoud Soltani Helisadi**, a 38-year-old teacher and the father of three-year-old triplets, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in Isfahan after being directly shot by government security forces.



**Mehdi Sepehran**, a 34-year-old, was killed during the protests in **Sadeghieh, Tehran**, on **January 8, 2026**, after being struck by a barrage of gunfire from security forces, with multiple bullets hitting his abdomen.

Mehdi worked in fashion design.



**Soheil Khazaei**, a 37-year-old, was killed during popular protests on **Thursday evening, January 8, 2026**, on **Golrizan Boulevard** in Kermanshah, after Islamic Republic security forces fired **two rounds of live ammunition** at him, striking his lower back and back.

Soheil holds a PhD in petroleum engineering.



**Davoud Jalili**, a 34-year-old resident of Shahin Shahr, Isfahan, was killed during protests in Shahin Shahr on **January 9, 2016**, after being struck by gunfire from security forces.

Davoud was an employee of **Azaran Foolad Isfahan**.



**Mahmoud Maleki**, a 39-year-old, was killed by security forces on **January 9, 2026**, in Najafabad, Isfahan. Mahmoud was a truck driver.



**Mahan Ghadami**, a 33-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in the Bagh-e Feyz area of Islamshahr during popular protests, after being shot by security forces. Mahan was a hairdresser.



**Nima Jozayi**, a 33-year-old, was killed after being directly shot by security forces during popular protests in the city of **Bushehr**. Nima was a fisherman.



**Omid Ramezani Sani**, a 37-year-old, was killed by security forces during the protests in the city of **Mashhad** on **January 8, 2026**. Omid worked as a taxi driver for the ride-hailing platform **Snapp**.



**Saeed Kiani**, a 30-year-old resident of Isfahan, was killed by government security forces on the evening of **January 9, 2026**. Saeed was an English language instructor.



**Masoud Ghaleh-Noei**, a 30-year-old resident of Tehran, was killed by security forces on **January 8, 2026**, in the **Tehranpars** neighborhood. Masoud worked as a sales assistant at a cosmetics store.



**Hamid Mahdavi**, a 38-year-old resident of Mashhad, was killed by security forces on **January 8, 2026**, on **Vakilabad Boulevard** in the city. Hamid was a firefighter.



**Mohammad Chegni Shakarmi**, a 31-year-old resident of Khorramabad, was killed after being shot by government security forces during the city's protests on **January 9, 2026**.

Mohammad was a driver.



**Mohsen Moghimi**, a 32-year-old resident of Abgarm in Qazvin Province, was killed by security forces on **January 9, 2026**. Mohsen was a driver.



**Mohammadreza Maskin-Navaz**, a 34-year-old resident of Tehran, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the **Narmak** neighborhood after being struck by live ammunition fired by security forces.

Mohammadreza was a carpenter.



**Mohammad Rusta**, a 41-year-old resident of Shiraz, was arrested on **January 10, 2026**, and his body was handed over to his family several days later. Visible signs of torture and a close-range execution shot were reportedly observed on his face.

Mohammad was a welder and steel-structure installer. He had taken to the streets in protest against the population's worsening economic and living conditions.



**Fatemeh Tabibi**, a 40-year-old resident of Isfahan, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, after being shot by government forces while walking home hand in hand with her young daughter.

Fatemeh worked as an accountant at **Sepehr Electrical and Electronics Store**.



**Sajad Pourhosseini**, a 41-year-old father of a 16-year-old daughter, was killed after being struck by live ammunition during protests in **Rasht** on **Friday, January 9, 2026**.

He worked at his father's grocery store. According to reports, his family was forced to put up a property deed worth **one billion tomans** as collateral in order to retrieve his body.



**Mostafa Safiyan**, a 40-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, during protests in the city of **Shahr-e Reza (Isfahan Province)** after being shot by Islamic Republic forces.

According to reports, security forces first fired **two pellet rounds** at him from the front, and then fatally shot him **from behind with live ammunition**.

Mostafa worked as a freight hauler, using his Nissan pickup truck to earn a living.



**Iman Mirshakari**, a 42-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 9, 2026**, in the **Qaemiyeh neighborhood of Chenar Shahijan**, Fars Province, after being shot **from close range and from behind** by security forces.

Iman was a **welder and industrial worker**.



**Abdollah Fathi Manjazi**, a 47-year-old father of three, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, after being shot by government forces during protests in the city of **Shushtar**.

Abdollah was a worker at the **National Steel Industrial Group of Ahvaz** and a consistent participant in the protests and strikes of the company's workers.



**Mojtaba Rusta'i**, a 40-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, after being shot with live ammunition by Islamic Republic security forces during protests in the **Afsarieh** district of Tehran.

Mojtaba was a cook at **Nakhl Café** in Afsarieh, Tehran.



**Morteza Tasbihi**, a 40-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, during widespread popular protests in Tehran after being struck by **three rounds of live ammunition** fired by security forces.


Morteza was a carpenter and worked at a furniture workshop in the **Siah Sang industrial area**.



**Farzaneh Tavakoli**, a 40-year-old, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in **Khaniabad, Tehran**, after being shot in the head by security forces. Farzaneh worked at a hair salon.



**Mehdi Eskandarian**, a 44-year-old, was killed on **Friday, January 9, 2026**, in **Fardis, Karaj**, after being shot with live ammunition by government security forces. Mehdi was a lathe operator and industrial worker.



**Abolghasem Babaei**, a 44-year-old, was killed on **January 10, 2026**, in **Vahidiyeh, Shahriar**, after being directly shot in the chest by security forces and repeatedly beaten on the head with batons. Abolghasem was a taxi driver.



**Ehsan Toufan** (also known as **Chatri**), a 40-year-old, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, during popular protests in **Bandar Abbas**, after being shot by security forces in front of the **IRIB (state broadcasting) building**. Ehsan worked as a laborer for the **Tipax** courier company.



**Babakhan Ashkour Ghorbani**, a 42-year-old, was killed by security forces on **January 8, 2026**, in **Shahsavar**. Babakhan was a laborer.



**Ali Akbar Tayebi Javid**, a 44-year-old resident of **Alvand**, Qazvin Province, was killed by government security forces during popular protests in the city on **January 8, 2026**. Ali Akbar was a language translator.



**Alireza Ansarifar**, known as **Yasin**, a teacher and Ministry of Education employee with a master's degree in psychology, was critically wounded on **January 8, 2026**, in the **Marlik** area of Karaj after being directly shot in the head with live ammunition. He remained in a coma for a week and subsequently died in hospital from his injuries.



**Hamid Shafiei**, a building electrical repair worker, was killed by direct gunfire from Islamic Republic security forces during nationwide protests against poverty, soaring prices, and the worsening cost-of-living crisis.

According to reports, his two young sons were also injured during the same protests.



**Abolfazl Jahani**, from the town of Niar in Ardabil Province, was killed during popular protests on **January 8, 2026**, after being struck directly in the head by a bullet fired by security forces.

Abolfazl worked as a laborer at a fast-food shop. His body was handed over to his family only after four days, and only after they were forced to pay substantial sums.



**Kourosh Ziaeи**, a retired worker of the Isfahan Steel Company, was killed on the night of **January 9, 2026**, near the **Chamgardan police station**, after being shot with live ammunition by security forces.

Like many other workers, he had taken to the streets in protest against the deteriorating economic conditions and the cost-of-living crisis.



**Abolfazl Khan Gheytaghı** was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, on **Haft-e Tir Boulevard** in **Mashhad**, after being directly targeted by live ammunition fired by Islamic Republic security forces.

Abolfazl was born in Quchan and held a **master's degree in steel project management**.



**Sahar Fallah** was killed by government security forces during popular protests in Tehran on **Friday, January 9, 2026**.


According to an informed source, she was shot in the head at **Third Square of Tehranpars** by snipers positioned on the rooftops of government buildings in the area and was killed instantly. Sahar was an employee of an immigration consultancy company.



**Ali Gardakaneh** was killed after being shot by security forces during popular protests in **Kangavar, Kermanshah Province**. The exact date of his killing is not known. Ali worked at a barbershop.



**Ali Shirafkan** was killed during the nationwide protests on **January 8, 2026**, after being shot **from behind with live ammunition** by Islamic Republic security forces at **Resalat Square in Tehran**. Ali was a professional industrial diver.



**Mohammad Kham Mohammadi**, a resident of Tehran, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, at **Kaj Square in Saadat Abad**, after being directly shot by security forces. Mohammad was a retired Air Force pilot.



**Amir Reza Mirzaei**, born in **1997**, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, after being shot in the **Vavan township of Islamshahr**. Amir Reza worked at his father's traditional tripe restaurant (*tabakhi*).



**Sonia Salehi Rad** was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in the **Sadra neighborhood of Shiraz**, after being shot in the head with live ammunition by government forces from a distance of approximately **six meters**. Sonia was a language teacher.



**Milad Mohabbi** was killed after being shot by government security forces during the popular protests of **January 2026** in **Kermanshah**. Milad was a laborer.



**Ehsan Akbari** was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the city of **Arak**, after being shot by security forces.

According to reports, Ehsan had gone out into the streets on the night of January 8 after returning from work, when security forces opened fire on him near **Shora Square**, striking him in the **abdomen, heart, and temple**. The shots were reportedly fired from the rooftop of a nearby school building.

Ehsan worked as a receptionist at a medical clinic.



**Babak Jamali** was killed during the night protests on **January 8, 2026**, in **Arak**, after being directly shot by security forces. Babak was an employee of the **Arak Refinery**.



**Sanaz Mousavi** was killed on **January 8, 2026**, in the **Haft-e Tir area of Mashhad**, after being shot in the head by security forces. Sanaz was an anesthesia specialist at one of Mashhad's hospitals.



**Behrouz Mansouri** and **Mansoureh Heydari**, a couple who stood by each other until the very last moment, were killed on **January 8, 2026**, in **Bushehr**, after being struck by live ammunition fired by government security forces.

Mansoureh was a nurse, and Behrouz was an instructor at a technical and vocational training institute.



**Nasser Tavakolian**, a 50-year-old, was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, during protests in **Isfahan**, after being shot by Islamic Republic security forces.

According to reports, his vehicle was riddled with bullets at around **9:00 p.m.** outside **Sadooghi Hospital** in Isfahan. Nasser was a butcher.



**Nima (Mohammad-Amin) Parsa** was killed on **Thursday, January 8, 2026**, during protests at **Tajrish Square in Tehran**, after being shot by security forces. Nima was an instructor of **Italian and English**.



**Rasoul Tahmasebi** was killed on **January 9, 2026**, in the **Naser Khosrow neighborhood of Khorramabad**, after being struck by live ammunition fired by security forces during popular protests in the city.

Rasoul was a fruit vendor.



Mones was an employee of an insurance brokerage firm.





Mohammad Mehdi worked as a laborer at a fruit shop.



**Mohammad Hossein Kimiaeи**, a resident of Mashhad, was killed on **January 8, 2026**, during popular protests in the **Hashemiyyeh** neighborhood after being struck by gunfire from government security forces.  
Mohammad Hossein was a university professor.



**Mehdi Jamshidi**, a resident of **Rostamabad, Gilan Province**, was killed on the night of **January 8, 2026**, after being shot by security forces in front of a **Basij base**.

Mehdi was a hairdresser.



**Rostam Mobarakabadi** was killed after being directly shot with live ammunition by security forces during the **January 2026 uprising in Mobarakeh County, Isfahan Province**.

Rostam was a truck driver.



**Mojtaba Rezaei**, a 38-year-old from **Qiamdasht, Tehran**, was killed on **Friday, January 9, 2026**, during the popular uprising after being directly struck by live ammunition fired by security forces.

Mojtaba was a cabinet maker.



**Behrouz Bigdeli Qashqai** was killed on **January 9, 2026**, during popular protests in the city of **Baharestan, Isfahan**, after being shot by security forces.

Behrouz was an auto body repair worker.



**Ghodratollah Kaid Khorde** was killed on **January 9, 2026**, during popular protests in **Dezful**, after being shot by government security forces.

Ghodratollah was an employee at the **Gotvand Dam**.



**Matin Abbasi**, a 19-year-old resident of **Shahriar**, was killed on **January 9, 2026**, by government security forces during popular protests in the city.

Matin worked as a curtain installer.
